A Message from Pastor Mike

Happy Month of Love! This year Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday both fall on February 14. That doesn't happen very often – it occurred in 1923, 1934, 1945, and 2018. It will happen only once more this century, in 2029. What a wonderful convergence! The day of love is the day we begin Lent, which immerses us once again in the greatest love story ever: God shows His love by giving His life on the cross for our forgiveness and salvation.

You have probably heard that the original language of the New Testament, Greek, has several words for love. The most common term for God's love and for the love of Christians is "agapao" or "agape love" (pronounced ah-gah-pay), which shows up 320 times in the New Testament and 324 times in the Greek translation of the Old Testament, called the Septuagint. That's a lot of love!

Every single one of those occurrences of this word for "love" applies to our life together at Mt. Olive. I just want to point out one or two examples.

2 Thessalonians 1:3 (ESV) — We ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of every one of you for one another is increasing.

Our church is increasing in new members, but at the same time decreasing in numbers as we send dear ones across the goal line into heaven. We are not increasing in ways that can be counted such as the number of activities or number of people who attend worship and Bible Study and other events. But by the grace of God we are increasing in love!

Many people in our families and church family have been facing great trials recently. But there is no trial that has to be faced alone. There is love that empowers us to face our trials with faith and hope in God. There have been a few Sundays recently when I have felt so weak before the worship service, physically and/or emotionally, but after receiving God's love in His Word and in The Lord's Supper and through the communion of believers, I have felt so much better after our worship and fellowship time. I, together with Kathy and our children, have experienced your increasing love for us and for one another. Praise God for His love at work in His people!

Hebrews 10:19–25 (ESV) —Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus...let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith...let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering...and <u>let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works</u>, not neglecting to meet together...but encouraging one another.

We thank God for you, people of Mt. Olive, for loving and encouraging each other – and for loving and encouraging me and my family! We love you.

Applying Biblical Teachings

The Psalmist wrote in Psalm 145:16, "You open your hand and satisfy the desires of every living thing." Indeed, God is the great Provider, the One who supplies each of us with what we need to support this body and life. All that we have materially in this life is a blessing from God. In Deuteronomy 8:17-18, we read, "You may say to yourself, 'My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me.' But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth." As Christians we are led to realize that God gives us His blessings for our benefit and for us to serve our neighbor. The way we use these blessings glorifies God. "So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God" (1 Cor. 10:31). Through the atoning blood of Christ, we are free to use our God-given blessings to God's glory.
