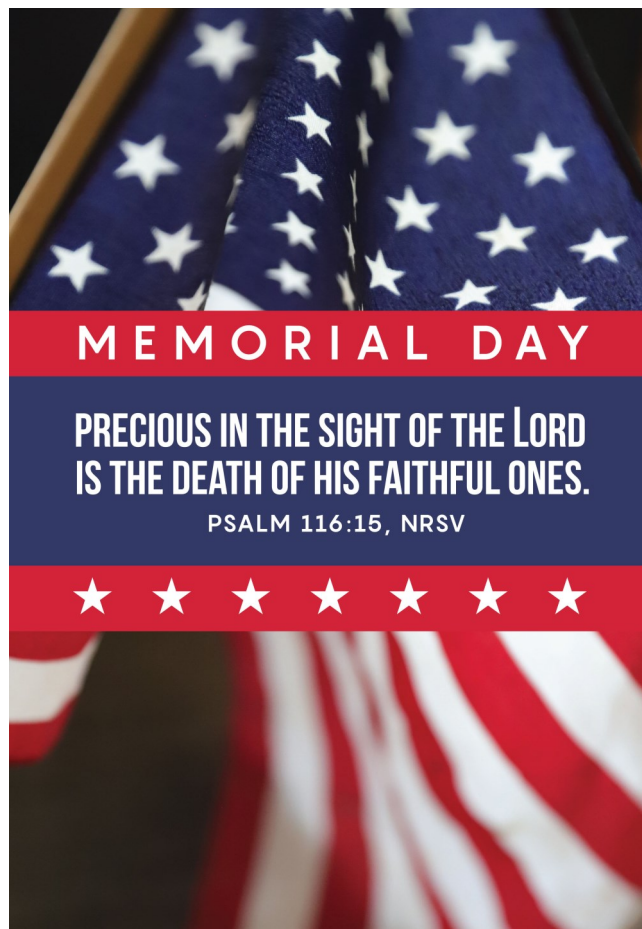

Tommy's Olympic Speed Walk

Get ready to speed walk your way to food, fun, and the best after party at Tommy's Olympic Speed Walk, an annual charity event in support of the BeLikeTommy Project. Registration is now open for the second annual walk, which will be held on Sunday, June 11, at 10 a.m. at Mound Westonka High School.

Tommy Nash was 14 years old when he passed away in December 2021 from cardiac arrest while sledding. Tommy was known for his inclusiveness, kindness, and for bringing joy to others. To honor Tommy, the Nash family created the BeLikeTommy Project.

The walk attracted over 500 people last year and organizers are hoping for another great event this year. Tommy aspired to be an Olympic Speed Walker and in the months before his passing you could find him practicing his speed walking form. This event is intended to be a celebration of his life, and to keep his fun and creative spirit alive while raising money to support the foundation. This event is not about distance or speed but is open to all ages and abilities!

In addition to the speed walk, the event will include a DJ, food trucks, bouncy houses, and fire truck tours. Organizers are also looking for volunteer help on this amazing day.

Numbers 11:24–30

²⁴Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD. And he gathered seventy
