#### A Message from Pastor Mike

#### A Summertime Conversation

You can't help but interact with creation in Minnesota in the summertime! The interactions are mostly positive – think quiet evenings at a campfire, looking out over a beautiful lake, hearing the distant calls of loons. But there are annoying elements to these interactions as well – algae blooms, sunburns, gnats, and mosquitoes! What are your plans for spending time in nature this summer?

Let's imagine a conversation between neighbors, Joe and Tom, who decide to go fishing. The fish aren't biting, so Joe and Tom get to talking...

Joe: You just can't beat being out in the boat on a Minnesota lake in June!

Tom: That's for sure. It's beautiful out here. It's like heaven on earth.

Joe: Yep. Makes me wonder how heaven is going to be better than this.

Tom: You believe in heaven?

*Joe:* I do! I believe God made all this beauty, and He wants us to enjoy it and see His hand at work in all of it. *Tom:* What do you mean?

**Joe:** Well, in this book of the Bible called Colossians it says that all things were created through Jesus and for Him. It also says that Jesus is reconciling all things to God. (Col. 1:15-20)

Tom: Reconciling? I don't get it.

*Joe:* Well, think of it this way. Everybody agrees that there are some pretty special, beautiful places in the world. *Tom:* Like this lake!

**Joe:** Like this lake. But you have to admit there are more than a few problems. I mean, animals hunt other animals, things die, storms blow in with lots of destruction...

Tom: And the state bird of Minnesota – all these stupid mosquitoes!

**Joe:** For sure. So on the one hand you have all this natural beauty, but on the other hand, you have death and destruction and decay and disease.

Tom: I guess that's just the way things have evolved.

**Joe:** I believe that all the death and destruction and decay happens because we are always fighting against God – and that's where Jesus' reconciliation comes in. He reconciles all things to God through His death and resurrection, and so we can find peace with God, peace with each other, and peace with creation.

Tom: Yeah, if the big corporations don't ruin it all.

**Joe:** Well, I think that each of us has to take responsibility for caring for each other and for the creation, and the best way I know how to do that is by following Jesus. When I was a teenager I went camping with my best friend and his family. One night at the campfire, his mom said something that has always stuck with me. She said that the reason all the trees and rivers and mountains and animals are so beautiful to us is because they are doing what God designed them to do. Then she said that if we could learn to do what God has designed us to do, we could also show that same beauty.

Tom: How do we do that?

*Joe:* Tom, I want to invite you to my church. Would you come with me to my men's Bible Study next week? You don't have to know anything about the Bible – just come and listen as we talk about God's plan and the love Jesus has for everybody – and for the whole creation. Oh, and we also talk a lot about fishing!

Tom: I guess I could try that. Nothing good on TV anyway!

**Joe:** You got that right. I'll text you the details – I could even pick you up if you like.

Tom: Alright, you got me. You guys aren't going to make me some weird cult member, are you?

Joe: Ooohhh yeah – I forgot to tell you to bring some bones and some blood with you.

Tom: What?

*Joe:* I'm kidding! Just come as you are – you don't have to bring anything – not even a Bible. We've got plenty! *Tom:* Okay...

Joe: Tell you what. Come with me one time, and if you don't like it, no problem! We can still hang out.

**Tom:** OK I guess it won't hurt me to get some religion. But right now I'm thinking we better head in. I don't like the looks of those dark clouds over there.

Joe: I'm sure glad we had a chance to spend time on this beautiful lake. Let's get going!

#### **Applying Biblical Teachings**




