EPISTLE

Romans 6:1–11

[A] The Epistle is from Romans, chapter 6.

¹What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as

Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷For one who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. ¹¹So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

P For all those bruised and afflicted in spirit,

them out of their afflictions, let us pray to the Lord:

C Lord, have mercy.

P For all who have received Holy Baptism, that they
would treasure this heavenly gift and so receive
the body and blood of Christ for their forgiveness,
life and salvation, let us pray to the Lord:

C Lord, have mercy.

P That we who have died to this world in Holy
Baptism would ever more and more live in the
resurrected life of Christ, let us pray to the Lord:

C Lord, have mercy.

P Lord God, heavenly Father, You manifested
Yourself with the Holy Spirit in the fullness of grace
at the Baptism of Your dear Son. With Your voice,

You directed us to the One who has borne our sins, that we may receive grace and forgiveness. Keep us, we implore You, in the true faith. Since we have been baptized in accordance with Your command and the example of Your Son, strengthen our faith by Your Holy Spirit and lead us to everlasting life and salvation; through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
