80th Convention Minnesota South District, LCMS

June 12-14, 2025

The 80th Minnesota South District Convention will be held June 12-14, 2025 at Gangelhoff Center at Concordia University - St. Paul. Pastor Mike and Joel Reinitz will be serving as our delegates.

The convention mission offering will go towards the **Educator Faithful Formation Fund**. Proceeds from this fund will be used to assist non-rostered educators in our Lutheran Schools, especially our Early Learning Centers, in receiving appropriate Lutheran-centered training that will put them in a position to pursue colloquy and enter the commissioned minister roster of the LCMS. We need Lutheran teachers in our Lutheran schools, and this will equip those already working in the schools to understand and teach the wonderful Gospel-centered truth of God's Word more effectively. A Message from Pastor Mike

Jesus ascended in order to multiply His ministry

A man does his job well and so he is promoted to manager. Now he can help other workers to be successful as well. A woman does a good job as teacher and so she is promoted to principal. Now she can help all the teachers in her school to have greater success in their teaching. A person serving on the local school board does his or her job well, and subsequently they are elected to a higher office. Now they can help others to be successful in their leadership as well. Isn't that the way it's supposed to work? Too often we see people using their promotion to serve themselves and to accumulate more power and money instead of serving others so that they too can do beter and share the fruits of their success with others.

Jesus accomplished His mission, atoning for all the sins of all mankind. God the Father worked His great might "in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come. And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all." (Ephesians 1:20-23) Jesus was "promoted" so that His followers, the church, could be successful in their mission, proclaiming Christ's victory to all people.

Jesus did not desire to accumulate more money or power or glory for Himself, but He desires to share His glory with His disciples. He prays, "Father, I desire that they also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory that you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world." (John 17:24) Because Jesus has risen from the dead, we too shall arise! Because Jesus has ascended to heaven, we too shall ascend!

The Ascension does not mean that Jesus left us – rather Jesus ascended physically so that He might be with us sacramentally. Because, as we confess in the Creed, He is now seated at the right hand of God, the place of power over all creation, He is powerfully with us in Baptism, where He joins us to His death and resurrection. He is powerfully with us in The Lord's Supper, where we receive His body and blood – fully human and fully divine. He is powerfully with us in the Word spoken, studied, sung, and shared. And what is this power for? Not power to use and manipulate others for our own selfish, sinful goals! But He exercises His power through the Word and Sacraments to share His success and His glory with us. Because Jesus ascended, He multiplied His ministry. Now He is here for us with all of His resurrection power and glory so that we too might be successful – successful at living like a follower of Jesus Christ. Successful at serving like Jesus served, successful at loving one another, forgiving, encouraging, equipping – successful at all the things which build up the body of Christ.

The celebration of Ascension occurs this year on Thursday, May 29. (We will include this celebration in our worship service on June 1st.) We celebrate with joy and confidence, knowing that Jesus is governing all things, interceding for us, giving His gifts, doing everything for the sake of His church, so that we can faithfully accomplish our part of His mission, proclaiming His victory and salvation wherever and whenever we can. May God defeat any sinful human agendas which try to creep into the church, and grant us success as we recommit ourselves every day to HIS agenda, "knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence." (2 Cor. 4:14) "For THINE IS the Kingdom and the Power and the Glory, forever and ever, Amen."

Applying Biblical Teachings

"Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for he who loves his fellowman has fulfilled the law" (Romans 13:8).

By our attitudes and conduct, those around us should regard us as servants of Christ. As Christ's servants, we show great integrity and honesty in our dealings with others. When we incur a debt, whatever that debt may be, we repay it according to the instruction given in Psalm 37:21 - "The wicked borrow and do not repay, but the righteous give generously."

We have been brought to faith by the Holy Spirit working through the Word, and from this faith, our attitudes and conduct proceed. These attitudes and conduct directly reflect Christ's love. In this love, we take care of all our obligations owed to others.

In his commentary, Matthew Henry wrote, "Render to God His due in the first place, to yourselves, to your families, to your relations, to the commonwealth, to the church, to the poor, to those that you have dealings with in buying, selling, exchanging, etc. Render to all their dues, and that readily and cheerfully, not tarrying till you are by law compelled to it."

Motivated by the Holy Spirit, our attitudes and conduct go beyond any sense of duty that may be derived by individuals. This motivation arises from the debt that can never be marked as "paid in full," the debt of love. God so loved us that He sent His Son, Jesus Christ, who in love met our deepest needs. We, in turn, as servants of Christ, show this same love toward others. We show great integrity and are truly honest in all of our dealings. We gladly repay the debts we owe. In Christ's love, we serve and do not sin against our neighbor, which may harm him and bring the condemnation of the Law. Rather, in the role of servant, Christ's love lives and works through us, thus fulfilling the Law and doing the will of God.
