The trustees have been working on several things these past months with help from volunteers. Some of the items that were done are the completion of the roof repairs on the parsonage. We hired a new company after several estimates to do the work. Excel Renovations out of Maple Plain were the least expensive and most knowledgeable about our project. We replaced the faucet in the women's restroom in the fellowship hall. We are in the process of replacing some ceiling lights in the education wing with led lighting. We are looking into some work that needs to be done in the kitchen dishwasher heating tank and faucet. We removed a dead tree from the front of the church and hauled it away. We also continue to remove bugs from the sanctuary before service on Sunday. Elevator monthly fire test was completed and the heat turned on for the winter.

Thank you all for your support in keeping our facility ready to serve members and our community. We couldn't do it without you all.

3rd Quarter Congregational Meeting 12/7/2025 Finance Report by Terry Podratz

The Mount Olive boards are busy working on budgets for 2026 and that is keeping me busy too.

In this final quarter, Mt Olive expenses have been higher than usual due to parsonage updates. Those updates include a new roof, plumbing issues and in November a new water softener.

In October Parsonage Maintenance & Repair shows \$12,723.60. This total consists of \$4472 paid to Tonka Plumbing and \$8251.60 to Excel Renovations. Due to these high expenses \$20,000 was transferred from the Thrivent Funds interest-bearing account to MN Lakes Bank checking. This transfer provides a nice positive cash flow as of October 31st, however only the

first half payment to Excel (\$8251.60) for the new roof has been paid. Now that the roof is completed the balance due Excel Renovations as well as the cost for a new water softener will be reflected in November expenses. I hope to have the November financial report prepared by our Congregational meeting.

Kevin and I are trying to find time to work together so that he can learn all the intricacies of the treasurer position. There are many things that only happen annually, and year end is of course the most difficult time.

If anyone has questions about our finances I will be happy to answer or research and get back to you if I don't know the answers off the top of my head.
